This extremely marketable and desirable combination is recommended for Multimedia Journalism majors who desire to work in American border cities or in Latin American countries, as well as for students seeking a Single-Subject Teaching Credential. The student completes an internship at a bilingual newspaper, magazine, radio, or television station. A maximum

of two of the required upper-division literature courses in the Multimedia Journalism major may be in Spanish or Latin American literature.
